Board adds professional boundaries training question to license renewal application

The Georgia Composite Medical Board has added a new question to the physician license renewal application asking if the licensee has completed education and training in professional boundaries and physician sexual misconduct.

O.C.G.A. § 43-34-11(a)(6) requires all physicians "to receive one-time education and training, for a minimum of two hours, regarding professional boundaries and physician sexual misconduct," and the CME "shall include subject matter relating to how to proceed with basic as well as sensitive or intimate examinations and the communication with patients that is required as a component of such examinations."

"The Board takes physician sexual misconduct issues very seriously," said GCMB Chairman Matthew Norman, MD. "With physicians now required to complete this education and training, they will be better equipped to recognize and prevent potential boundary violations, ultimately leading to a safer environment for patients seeking medical care."

Renewal applicants who answer "no" will have the license placed on hold and it will not renew until Board staff removes the hold. Staff will remove the hold upon the licensee submitting documentation of successful completion of the education. The new renewal application will begin for physician license renewals with an expiration of Feb. 28, 2023.

This two-hour education and training only needs to be completed once during a physician's career and may count toward the required 40 hours of continuing education per licensure cycle, if meeting other CME guidelines.

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CDC releases updated clinical practice guidelines for prescribing opioids for pain

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has released updated and expanded recommendations for clinicians providing pain care for adult outpatients with short- and long-term pain. These clinical recommendations, published in the CDC Clinical Practice Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Pain, will help clinicians work with their patients to ensure the safest and most effective pain care is provided.

"The updated guidance from CDC should aid Georgia's physicians with the best practices to treat pain and bring relief to patients while ensuring patient safety," said Georgia Composite Medical Board Chairperson Matthew Norman, MD. "The Board has reviewed this guidance and encourages physicians to heed these recommendations when prescribing opioids to treat pain."

The publication updates and replaces the CDC Guideline for Prescribing Opioids for Chronic Pain released in 2016.

GCMB announces electronic copies of licenses now available

As of December 2022, holders of a Georgia Composite Medical Board license can access an electronic copy of the license through the Board's online account portal.

"The Board is committed to providing a customer-centric experience for our applicants and licensees," said Executive Director Daniel Dorsey. "This new feature will give licensees immediate access to a copy of their licenses while also eliminating the reprint fee."

Historically, the Board has printed and mailed a paper copy of the professional license upon issuance or renewal. Licensees can now access a pdf copy of their license at any time and from anywhere via the online portal. In the example screenshot below, a button to "Print License" should appear for any license in active status.

The online account portal is also where licensees can renew their license or update mailing/practice addresses.
