ABOUT THE BOARD

The Board consists of sixteen (16) members: thirteen (13) physicians, two (2) consumer members, and one (1) physician assistant ex-officio member. Each member of the Board is assigned to various committees to participate in the decision-making functions of the Board. The following list briefly describes committees of the Georgia Composite Medical Board.

The Investigative Committee is comprised of four (4) members of the Board. The Committee examines initial complaints, the results of all investigations, and medical malpractice reports. The Committee then makes recommendations to the full Board for actions to be taken on complaints and investigations as well as disciplinary matters.

The Physician Licensing Committee is comprised of four (4) members of the Board. The Committee evaluates each applicant's fitness to practice his or her profession in Georgia. It does this by establishing standards for licensure and practice, reviewing all non-routine applications, and conducting interviews with applicants as needed each month in order to grant licenses. The committee sets policy regarding the applications process and develops procedures for staff to handle non-routine applications. This committee also develops rules for physician licensure.

The Impaired Professionals Committee is comprised of five (5) members of the Board. They are charged with reviewing all new cases wherein licensee conduct may have or already has impacted their practice or return to practice. The Committee meets with the practitioner, advocate, and treating physician and assesses the practitioner's individual situation and ability to return to practice and any possible discipline or restrictions to the licensee's practice. The Committee maintains a list of acceptable treatment programs and also reviews requests from treatment facilities to be added to the approved list.

The Rules Committee is comprised of all members of the Board. It was created to develop rules to govern the performance of health care practitioners regulated by the Board. Its goal is to assist the Board in defining, assessing, and ensuring the continued competency of all licensees throughout their professional careers.

Advisory Committees. The Board has six (6) Advisory Committees comprised of licensed professionals from the community. There are two (2) or more members of the Board on each advisory committee. The Board regulates the following professions:

During the committee meetings the staff, along with a member of the Office of the Attorney General, is present to answer questions from the committee members. The Committee makes its recommendation to the full board for consideration and approval. **All matters reviewed and discussed before the Board Committees are sent to the full board for final review and approval.**

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THE BOARD WELCOMES NEW BOARD MEMBER

Effective November 17, 2009, Governor Perdue appointed David W. Retterbush, MD, of Valdosta, Georgia, to the Medical Board to fill the new position created by the passage of House Bill 509.

The Purpose and Mission of the Georgia Composite Medical Board

Purpose: The *Georgia Composite Medical Board* is the state agency that licenses physicians, physician assistants, respiratory care professionals, perfusionists, acupuncturists, orthotists, prosthetists and auricular (ear) detoxification specialists. The Medical Board also investigates complaints and disciplines those who violate *The Medical Practice Act* or other laws governing the professional behavior of its licensees and unlicensed practice.

Mission Statement: The mission of the *Georgia Composite Medical Board* is to protect the health of Georgians through the proper licensing of physicians and certain members of the healing arts and through the objective enforcement of the *Medical Practice Act*.

MESSAGE FROM LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR CASEY CAGEL

CE, Immunity, and “Safety Net” Clinics

As Lieutenant Governor I have long supported Georgia’s “safety net” clinics -- communities of individuals who come together to provide free or low-cost health care to the less fortunate.

These clinics help provide Georgians who are uninsured and underinsured with a medical home. However, these clinics would be unable to operate on a day-to-day basis without the help of doctors like you. I commend the volunteers who have given tirelessly of their time for the health of others, but there are still many more volunteers needed.

Thanks to the Georgia Composite Medical Board (GCMB) and the Georgia Board of Dentistry, doctors and dentists who volunteer their time can earn *one continuing education credit for every four (4) hours volunteered at a clinic*. Every two (2) years, ten (10) hours of CE credit can be obtained by volunteering at a clinic. For the latest rules pertaining to the GCMB, please visit www.medicalboard.georgia.gov.

In addition, recent changes to Georgia law regarding the Georgia Volunteer Health Care Program were made with the passage of S.B. 133 by Sen. Lee Hawkins (R-Gainesville). This new law “expands the state’s immunity to cover licensed practical nurses, registered professional nurses, nurse midwives, and advanced practical nurses employed by safety net clinics.” Furthermore, doctors who are paid by a hospital but work at a free clinic may also be eligible for immunity protections. The Georgia Department of Community Health has adopted rules and regulations for the implementation of this expanded immunity and can answer questions for those who would like to take advantage of this benefit. KEEP YOUR INFORMATION CURRENT WITH THE BOARD

Sixty (60) days before your license expiration the Board sends a **courtesy reminder** to your address of record, noting the date(s) to renew your license. Each month many of these notices are returned to us because the licensee’s address has changed. As a result, your license could expire or lapse and have to be reinstated. Reinstatements may require a public consent order with a fine and a reprimand for practicing without a license. Please keep the Board informed of your correct address. You can view and confirm your address at the Board’s website at www.medicalboard.georgia.gov If you need to change your address you may do so at any time using our online system, or you may fax your information to the Board office at (404) 656-9723.

HOW TO BECOME A DISPENSING PHYSICIAN

State law allows physicians to dispense pharmaceuticals (in addition to samples) from their office only after notifying the Georgia Composite Medical Board in writing of their intent to act as a dispensing physician. This notification may be made by letter to the Board, or may be noted on the renewal of license form. Once this notification is received by the Board, a copy is kept on file in our office and a copy is forwarded to the Georgia Pharmacy Board. The Pharmacy Board keeps a copy and sends an additional copy to the Georgia Drugs and Narcotics Agency (GDNA), the agency that enforces the pharmacy law. The GDNA notifies the Agent in the appropriate territory of the state which physicians in their territory have dispensing authority.

WHO CAN GIVE IV INJECTIONS?

[NOTE: The term "IV Injections" should not be construed to include subcutaneous or intramuscular injections such as flu shots, but refers only to intravenous injections which are *typically* used in hospitals or institutional settings.]

Registered Nurse (RN) - YES

LPN - YES

Physician (MD) (DO) - YES

Physician Assistant - YES

Advanced Practice Nurse (APRN) - YES

Medical Assistants - NO

EMT - not unless the EMT is functioning under protocol during a medical emergency; not as an employee of a physician.

NEW WALLET ID CARDS

The look of our wallet identification cards has changed! The Georgia Composite Medical Board has improved the look and feel of its wallet ID cards. The new cards are lightly laminated and have been mailed to new and renewing licensees beginning October 1, 2009. Simply peel off the card, fold it, and sign the back. ONLINE SYSTEM, USER IDENTIFICATION (ID) AND PASSWORD

The Board is excited about its new online application service, which was implemented in December 2008. This system is secure and full-featured, offering applicants and licensees the ability to log in with a secure user ID and password to apply for and maintain almost any aspect of their license and/or application. If you renewed online after December 2008 you have had the opportunity to access this new online system.

There is no monetary compensation to serve on these committees, but you will be involved in shaping policy for your profession.

DID YOU KNOW?

- That you must have a chaperone present when conducting a physician examination of the breasts and/or genitalia on a patient of the opposite sex.
- It is illegal to have pre-signed prescription pads in your office. Prescriptions must be signed and dated when issued to the patient.
- It is illegal to write prescriptions for controlled substances for personal use or, except for documented emergencies, for immediate family members who include spouses, children, siblings, and parents.
- It is illegal to commit an act of sexual intimacy, abuse, misconduct or exploitation of any individual related to the physician's practice of medicine regardless of the consent. This also applies to former patients where the licensee did not terminate in writing the physician patient relationship before engaging in a romantic or sexual relationship with the patient.
- You must not practice after the expiration of your license (this includes prescribing).

FRAUD ALERT!

If you receive a call from someone representing themselves as an employee of the Georgia Composite Medical Board and requesting your credit card number, social security number, or demanding payment for any purpose, please be advised this is NOT the practice of the Georgia Composite Medical Board and may be an attempt by others to obtain this information for illegal purposes. Physician Assistants and Anesthesia Assistants

Please remember that each type of physician assistant is restricted to the scope of practice of his/her supervising physician and that a physician assistant cannot serve as an anesthesiologist assistant. Likewise, an anesthesiologist assistant cannot perform the medical duties of a PA. Each must earn continuing medical education applicable to his/her area of practice.

Fee-Exempt Physician Assistants

If you are a physician assistant who is currently employed in a state or county facility, you are fee-exempt and your license fee or renewal fee is waived. Did you know that you can apply **ONLINE** for a license AND renew your license online as a fee-exempt employee? Contact the Board directly for additional information.
